

### Meet Heather Ferrero, Member of the Board of Directors

What made you interested in taking up GIS/geospatial technology as
a career and how did you end up in the field

of GIS? What is your educational background?

I have always enjoyed thumbing through atlases and gas station maps, but it was in college that my love for maps flourished. I received a B.A. in Geography from SUNY Geneseo and my M.A. in Geography from Miami University. Before college, I did not even know that majoring in Geography was even possible!



During an internship with the Livingston County Planning Department, I dabbled in addressing maps, zoning maps, and project maps in Atlas for DOS, and I realized that making maps using GIS could be a career option.

Can you explain your job and what you do there?

I am the Deputy Planning Director for Livingston County, and my job runs the gamut from overseeing the operations of the County Planning Board, County Agricultural & Farmland Protection Board, Conesus Lake Watershed Council, and County Environmental Management Council to supporting the County's ArcGIS Enterprise and Planning Department desktop mapping.

I have been with Livingston County for 24 years as an intern, a Planning Assistant, a Planner, and a Deputy Planning Director. My career has grown from making maps for county departments to a complex orchestra of program management, grant administration, technical assistance in all its varieties, and managing our mapping program.

Members come from the private sector, the public sector, the education sector, and more – all approaching mapping from different perspectives. We learn together and from each other, and being active in the Association strengthens the connections we have as a group while creating new connections across the State. Being active is a great way to give back to our profession There are many opportunities to participate that can fit into busy schedules.

 How else have you shared your expertise in GIS with others in NYS either formally or informally? (other committees, mentoring, school/university presentations, etc.)

It is important to me to support students and help them grow both in mapping and in their career paths. My internship with Livingston County back in the day was instrumental in helping decide the path of my career in public service, and I have been paying it forward since then. The Planning Department has a strong partnership with the SUNY Geneseo Geography Department, and we have been hosting GIS and research internships for over two decades. My goal is to give students practical mapping/research experience and to help prepare them for interviews with future employers. The learning goes both ways - inevitably, I end up learning new GIS tips and tricks with every GIS intern who comes through the door, and they learn some shortcuts and best practices that are won through experience.

Every once in a while, I get a chance to pop into a Beginner GIS class at SUNY Geneseo or an Environmental Science class at Livonia High School as a guest lecturer on real-world GIS mapping applications in the workforce.

I am also Secretary for GIS/SIG, an educational user's group in the Genesee/Finger Lakes region whose primary mission is to foster the understanding of GIS technology.

What is the most interesting project that you have worked on and why?

The most interesting project I worked on was for the Sheriff's Office, but I cannot divulge that one. However, my passion project is the Livingston County online map. While online mapping is now commonplace, when we created the Livingston County online map, it was the first time the public could interact with the County's GIS data from the comfort of their home or out in the world on their cell phone. Based on the range of people who call the office in the infrequent event of a map or server outage, it has become a valuable resource

#### • What do you like most about mapping?

What I like most is the intersection of science and art in GIS mapping. The beauty and utility of maps can communicate messages to a reader much faster than reading a 100-page report, and the mapmaker can craft that message with design decisions and cartographic choices. Maps have power, and we as GIS professionals have an obligation to use that power with care.

• If you could visit any one place in the world, where would it be and why?

Venice is on my bucket list because I am a sucker for history, canals, and Italian food. I have specified to my husband that the place is Venice, Italy – not cities named Venice in Florida, California, Illinois, etc., not Venice in Epcot, and not the Venetian in Las Vegas.

• Do you have any specific advice or philosophies from working in the GIS world?

Mapping software and technical capabilities are constantly changing and improving in the world of GIS, and it is important to stay on top of new developments and be aware of what direction the industry is heading.

Forgive the analogy, but with mapping software, I tend to work inside the box: work to become fluent in the software I am using at the time – I even decorate the interior walls of the box – but I have learned over the years to carve windows in the box in order to see change coming.
